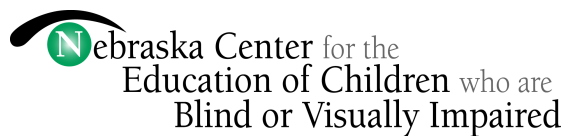


Transition Workshop

for Parents of Students who are Blind or Visually Impaired and/or Deaf-Blind

This workshop will focus on parents of students who are considering going on to post-secondary education, obtaining gainful employment, and/or living independently after high school graduation.

Students are invited to attend and will spend time participating in recreation and leisure activities, while parents attend the workshop.

There is no cost to attend.

Transition is the process for preparing your student for where he or she will live, work, and learn after high school. The best practice for preparing for life after high school is to start planning early, as young as 12 and 14 years of age. Teaching skills for furthering education, obtaining employment, and living independently can be started even earlier.

This workshop will build on information provided at the fall 2017 meeting. We will discuss more about transition and the IEP process, the Expanded Core Curriculum's relationship to transition, independent living, adjusting to college for people with disabilities, accessing accommodations through disability services, and agencies available to provide assistance. ***Attendance at the fall 2017 meeting is not a requirement to attend this workshop.***

She provides Outreach services to students who are blind or visually impaired, parents, and teachers across the state of Nebraska.
